Why scientists should respond to Russia's criminalizing of

a US educational exchange

The Russian State Prosecutor's Office last month labeled Bard College "undesirable," claiming that its activities "pose a threat to the foundations of the constitutional order and security of the Russian Federation." The decision has criminalized and ended Bard's decades-long partnership with St. Petersburg University which, among other accomplishments, created Smolny College—the first liberal arts college in Russia. By law, anyone in Russia found guilty of associating with an "undesirable" organization may face significant fines and up to six years in prison. To read more, click here.




