

# **Academic Freedom Around the World**

According to a new study, produced by researchers at the

Friedrich-Alexander-Universität Institute of Political Science (FAUIPS, Erlangen-Nuremberg), Germany, and the V-Dem Institute in Gothenburg, Sweden, over the past decade, academic freedom has declined in more than 22 countries representing more than half of the world's population, four billion people. 




