S. Korea to inject \$70m into Al-powered public education



Divesting university endowments: Easier demanded than done

Todd L. Ely, associate professor of public administration and director of the Centre for Local Government at the University of Colorado Denver writes: "Endowments are pools of assets that originally come from donations. Non-profits and



some public organisations invest those assets, which grow over time, and disburse a small percentage of them annually to support their missions. Nearly all non-profit colleges and universities in the United States have endowments, as do hundreds of public institutions of higher education – some through associated non-profit foundations." 


